



CADET ASSESSMENT STUDY GUIDE

The main purpose of the 2FLY Pilot Assessment is to minimise risk. Professional pilot training is a significant investment and commitment, so it is therefore crucial we assess you before any major capital outlay is made. The purpose of the assessment is to ascertain that you have the necessary aptitude and potential to successfully complete a programme of commercial pilot training.

Your successful completion of the Assessment will result in you being offered a place on a 2FLY Pro-Pilot Programme.

2FLY's Assessment Process consists of two STAGES:

STAGE ONE

Initially, you will need to inform us whether you would like to complete the Assessment at home using your own computer, or at one of the several designated Assessment Centres which we have around the UK. Whichever you decide, you will register online and make a payment of £189 which will immediately allow you access to the online Assessment tests.

The tests consist of four modules:

Module 1 - Personality profiling

This Module looks at your personality, your values, your behaviour and your attitude. It consists of 262 multiple-choice questions. It has no time limit, but you should aim to finish within 30-45 minutes and in one attempt.

Module 2 - Maths test for pilots

The maths test is 30 minutes long and consists of 20 multiple-choice questions which become progressively more difficult. The test automatically finishes after 30 minutes whether or not you have answered all the questions.

Sample question (Calculators are allowed)

A car is travelling at a speed of 20 mph. How many miles will it travel in 4 hours?

A) 80 miles B) 60 miles C) 40 miles

Module 3 - Cognitive Pilot Aptitude Test (A headset is used for this part of the test)

This Module will measure and assess your aptitude in the following areas:

Numerical Reasoning

These questions test your ability to use, interpret and manipulate numbers and mathematical data.

Verbal Reasoning

These questions test your ability to analyse, interpret and understand written information.

Spatial Relationship Reasoning

These questions test your ability to see spatial patterns and move or rotate these in your mind to solve visual problems.

Abstract Reasoning

These questions test your ability to recognise patterns and similarities between shapes and figures.

Perceptual Speed and Accuracy

These questions test your ability to work quickly and accurately to find information from numbers or images.

Working Memory

These questions test your ability to hold, retrieve and use information held in short term memory.

All questions are multiple choice in format and will either have three or four answer options to select from, only one of which is correct.

Module 4 - The F.A.S.T. Test

You will complete two consecutive tests of seven and a half minutes each. The primary aim is to assess your ability to multi-task with the secondary aim of assessing your ability to learn and improve - hence the second test. Here is a summary of your tasks:



Click this 'aircraft' button as you see an aircraft through the cockpit window

Using your mouse answer all questions which appear in this box

Move your aircraft up and down using the arrow keys to avoid obstacles

Click this 'waypoint' button when you receive information that you are passing a waypoint

After the test, you will be quizzed about your observations during the flight - so pay attention to all that happens!

STAGE TWO

The results of your online Assessment will immediately generate a comprehensive four page report which will give us your profile and your potential to successfully complete a course of professional pilot training. STAGE TWO consists of a one-to-one informal interview with a 2FLY Training Advisor to go through this report with you and assess your training requirements based on the findings.

It may be possible that you would require some form of remedial training in order to increase your potential. Our partners, Resource group, have a range of short courses designed to do just this. Therefore, not passing the assessment and screening does not mean you cannot rectify any fault and take the assessment again with greater success.



If you are unable to attend STAGE TWO in person, we can arrange to conduct the interview via Skype or Facetime.

If you are successful in passing both STAGE ONE and TWO, you will be offered a place on the Pro-Pilot Programme enabling you to discuss start dates and payment options with your Training Advisor.

One other aspect of STAGE TWO is that you will also be assessed on your personal appearance and conduct while attending the process. Although the interview is basically informal in nature, and may be carried out via Skype or Facetime, these factors will be taken into account during the discussion. The areas assessed are shown below on the Check List below.

- Appearance
- Punctuality
- Employability
- Preparation
- Professional attitude
- Interpersonal skills
